**COLUMBUS, OHIO, MARCH 11, 2008** — WOSU Public Media and The Longaberger Company will host a special community event called Ohio War Stories: WWII on Thursday, April 3, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at The Longaberger Company Home Office, 1500 East Main Street, in Newark. This event, designed to help preserve World War II stories, extends the outreach efforts around Ken Burns' *The War*, a 14-hour television series that aired last September on WOSU TV.

Veterans, family members and anyone with a World War II interest are invited to tell their stories of World War II, from the battlefield experiences to what it was like on the home front. Participants also can bring WWII photos, letters, souvenirs and mementos to share along with their family stories. The stories will be videotaped and posted to WOSU's [ohiowarstories.org](http://ohiowarstories.org), an online collection of shared stories, images, videos and blogs that tell the tale of a diverse range of Ohioans' experiences in World War II.

There is no fee to attend the Ohio War Stories: WWII event, but reservations are encouraged. For those wishing to share memorabilia or other items, please do not bring weapons or munitions, as they are prohibited.
